The first European declaration in favour of the book will be signed on Thursday October 9

On Thursday 9 October at 11h, at the Frankfurt Book Fair (Room Consens Hall 4 EC), and on the initiative of Vincent Monadé, President of the Centre national du livre, several directors of European organizations in the publishing field (13 have confirmed their presence so far) will sign the first common declaration in favour of the book, in the presence of European professional federations and other French partners.

The objective of the declaration is to guarantee the respect of copyright and preserve the rights of readers. It aims to encourage the emergence of common positions for the defence of copyright, a reduced VAT rate for print and digital books and freedom of choice for the reader, in other words, the interoperability which allows readers to access any work on the device of their choice. Henceforth, collective actions could be organized in collaboration with European professional federations.
